CONDITIONS ON THE DAY AND THE NUMBER OF ENTRIES MAY FORCE CHANGES TO THESE RULES AND REGULATIONS. CHANGES AND QUERIES RELATING TO THESE REGULATIONS SHOULD BE ADDRESSED TO THE CONCOURS ADVISORY GROUP.

1. CONCOURS d'ELEGANCE CLASSES

The pinnacle of Club Concours, entries are by selection only. Owners are invited to offer their cars for consideration. Previous winners from Pride of Ownership will also be considered.

2. ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1 All competitors must be paid up members of PCGB. Entries must be made on the official entry form and submitted by the published closing date. You will need to submit a short résumé of your ownership experience and a number of photographs. Any entries received after this closing date will be considered at the discretion of the Concours Advisory Group.
- 2.2 Entries will be restricted to Porsche manufactured vehicles only.
- 2.3 Each vehicle must have current MOT where appropriate and be in road worthy condition. A safety inspection will not be part of the judging process.
- 2.4 Each competitor will receive all necessary display and judging information prior to the event.
- 2.5 Each accepted entry must be registered at the signing-on desk by the advised time.
- 2.6 The overall champion from 2019 CDE will not be eligible to enter.
- 2.7 NO trailered cars are permitted to enter the event venue. All entries must be driven under their own power from the outer entry gate into the venue to be parked in the allocated Concours parking area.

3. SCORING: GENERAL

The judges will be briefed to focus on cleanliness, quality of presentation and overall condition of the vehicle. Cleanliness, referring to all scoring areas having received attention. Presentation, referring to the level of precise detailing in all scoring areas. Overall condition referring to the appearance of all

scoring areas. In all classes originality and authenticity are key criteria.

4. SCORING: SPECIFICS

Vehicles will be judged as an assembled unit. Parts such as wheels, bumpers, etc, must be attached to the car in the specified position and manner. Hoods/soft tops/targa roof panels must be raised or in place as the case may be.

4.1 Each vehicle will be marked out of the possible total points as indicated on the judges marking sheet, according to the following categories – Exterior/Interior/Luggage bay/Engine bay*. Multiple judges will be used to provide a balanced view.

4.2 In each class there will be up to 30 additional Discretionary points available. Specific judges in the team will allocate these points.

4.3 In the event of a points tie at the completion of judging, the winner will be at the discretion of the Concours Advisory Group.

Attention is drawn that each competitor should display on their vehicle a Porsche Club GB badge Club GB badge on the front windscreen. Failure to display one of these badges as indicated will result in 5 points being deducted from the overall final score.

5. JUDGING

5.1 On arrival, you will be shown to your parking place. You should then “sign on” at the appointed time. when you will be advised of your entry number. Competitors should affix their competition hanger to the rearview mirror of their car and are asked to display their entry number clearly to help the judges locate it.

5.2 A briefing will be held prior to judging. This briefing will inform all entrants of the running order and outline the approximate timetable for the days event. It will also advise Health and Safety for the day.

5.3 When judging commences, please ensure you are with your vehicle at all times. At the appointed time, you will be requested to drive your car behind the marshal and onto the judging plinth. It is necessary that you remain with your vehicle throughout the judging process.

5.4 Once judging commences no further preparation can be performed on your vehicle apart from light dusting. Once called to the plinth, no further cleaning/dusting can take place.

5.5 The judging team will comprise of individuals selected for their broad knowledge of the Porsche marque who also have specialised knowledge to decide on certain points (particularly originality and authenticity).

5.6 There will be one team of judges to ensure consistency of judging. The same amount of time will be allocated on each car. The timekeeper will control this.

5.7 Judging is a difficult job. Please do not talk to or distract the judges during their task.

6. AWARDS

An awards ceremony will take place following the completion of judging at the event.

There will be permanent trophies for the winners to keep for each of the following classes. Classic, Modern Classic and Future Classic. In addition there is a CDE award for Best Engine bay across

all classes of CDE. This award will only apply to entries where engines are fully accessible. Awards are also given for Competitors Choice, Spirit of Concours and Compere/Celebrity's Choice.

The Judge's decision is final. Individual score sheets will be forwarded to each competitor after the event. Results will be published in Porsche Post.

7 HEALTH AND SAFETY

Competitors are reminded that they should take precautions to ensure the Health and Safety of themselves and others, for example: during vehicle preparation providing a board that is adequate to carry the weight of the vehicle and large enough to accommodate the size of the jack to enable the jack and/or axle stands to have a firm base when used on soft, rough or uneven ground. Additional support of vehicles when raised on jacks, i.e. axle stands, should be used.

Competitors should ensure that harmful substances are properly contained and wear any necessary PPE when handling these substances. The Concours area is a strictly non smoking area due to the fact that competitors may be using substances that contain flammable materials. Trip hazards should be avoided. The Concours area must be kept clear during preparation time with the exception of the Concours Coordinator, the competitors, the Concours judges and other appointed officials such as time keepers and marshals in order to avoid a member of the public being hurt. For their own safety whilst a car is jacked up and/or on axle stands, any person or persons accompanying Concours competitors (i.e. wives, children or friends) should cease assisting with the car preparation and leave the Concours area.

Any queries or matters arising regarding Health and Safety should be directed to the Health & Safety representative.
