What are the rules in England from 15 August 2020?

- In all other areas of England, two households can meet indoors or outside, including overnight stays.
- The two households must maintain social distancing throughout, unless they are <u>part of the same support bubble.</u>
- Indoor meetings of more than two households are not recommended, because of the higher infection risk.
- But households can meet with multiple others if each meeting is separate.
- Outdoors, people from multiple households can meet in groups of up to six.
- And two households of up to 30 people can meet up.
- People who are <u>clinically vulnerable and have been "shielding"</u> have now been told by the government that they do not need to shield for the moment.
