Our varied display included Andreas Tautscher's 1988 3.2 Targa, Emma & Josef Tautscher with their 2000 Yellow 996 C4 Cabriolet, 996 C2 and C4S, 997 C4S, 2011 GT3, Old school back dated 911, a Peridot Green Cayman R, and rounded off by Jeremy & Faye Spencer's Aqua Blue Boxster Spider, Speed Yellow 2007 911 Turbo and their stunning Carrara White 2007 GT2.

There were many other Marques present including Alfa Romeo 4C, 3 x Aston Martin, (Vantage V12S). Audi R8-V8 and R8-V10 plus RS4. Caterham 620R and CSR260. Cobra, 2 x Ferrari's, 3 x Lamborghini's, Lotus Evora S, 2 x Maserati Gran Turismo, McLaren 12C, and TVR Griffith & Tamora.

Thousands of locals & cruise liner passengers taking advantage of the good weather and alfresco dining along the seafront made for a very special atmosphere with many favourable comments being received from the public, particularly from American tourists who could not believe all the Supercars were Guernsey registered.

A live arena had been set up at the north beach car park where the Guernsey Motor Cycle & Car Club + Guernsey Kart Club entertained the crowds with a Twisty Sprint Stage for Bikes and an Oval track for racing car demonstration runs, while at the other end of the seafront an area had been created for a Autotest course.

There was also a Military vehicle display, Classic Cars & Bikes, Hillclimb & Sprint vehicles from the previous day and the local Piston Heads group display plus the usual food stalls and play area's for children.
