The major highlight of the tour is a rare opportunity to experience La Cata del Barrio de la Estación, a wine tourism event that takes place every two years in the Barrio de la Estación in Haro (La Rioja) where the largest number of century-old wineries in the world are concentrated. Here, in the streets of the Barrio de la Estación, you'll enjoy specially selected wine tastings and exquisite food pairings in a truly unforgettable setting.

But there's more. We start our tour by exploring the stunning Picos de Europa region that forms part of the northern Cantabrian Mountains. The range is situated in the Autonomous Communities of Asturias, Cantabria and Castile and León.

We end our tour by heading east into the Pyrenees. Lush valleys, high mountains, deep gorges and verdant landscapes, a perfect place to spend time and enjoy our company.




# Travel Day

#### Day 2 - Monday

On arrival at Santander, drive west to Parador de Cangas de Onis, west of Picos de Europa. [135 km, 2 hours]

#### Day 3 - Tuesday

Visit the and explore the scenic Picos foothills around Parador de Cangas de Onis such as the viewpoint at Mirador de la Reina.

#### Day 4 - Wednesday

Drive to Parador de Fuente De on the south east side of Picos de Europa. [130 km, 2 hours]

#### Day 5 - Thursday

Explore the scenic foothills around Parador de Fuente De such as the Teleferico cable car that ascends high into the Picos.



# Picos de Europa

**Day 2 - Day 5** 

The Picos de Europa is one of Spain's best kept secrets - a compact mountain range that straddles the provinces of Asturias, Cantabria and León.

As well as the opportunities and sites close to the Parador, we can drive into the hills to the many spectacular viewpoints such as the Mirador de la Reina.





### Parador Cangas de Onis

#### Day 2 & Day 3 Accommodation

Every Parador is a member of a chain of Spanish state-owned mid-to-premium quality hotels, usually located in historic buildings or in nature areas with a special appeal. The chain consists of 97 Parador Hotels in Spain and one in Portugal, with every one having its own restaurant offering local cuisine. They are known to offer excellent value for money.

Parador Cangas de Onis is known for its good standard of accommodation and excellent location on the edge of the Picos area. The town itself is of historic interest whilst it is easy to access the hills, walking areas and views nearby.




### Parador de Fuente Dé

#### **Day 4 & Day 5 Accommodation**

Located at the end of a rising valley road and at the base of the Teleferico cable car that ascends high into the Picos. There's terrific scenery around this location, great opportunities for sights and walking, with plenty of options for some great drives.

Short runs, driving loops and even a day's run-out have been identified. It's an ideal base from which to explore the entire Picos region.

### Parador de Argomaniz

#### Day 6 & Day 7 Accommodation


The Parador de Argomaniz is an elegant Renaissance palace that looks out over the plains of Alava and the Sierra de Gorbea. An ideal place to disconnect and relax, with reading areas, terrace and gardens.

The building, which dates back to 1712, occupies the Palacio de los Larrea, whose coat of arms can be seen on the façade.

The Parador was also a Descalced Carmelite convent before being converted into a palace, and during the Peninsular War it was used as a headquarters for French troops.

Legend has it that Napoleon planned the attack on Vitoria at this very place.

### Part 3 – East to the Pyrenees



#### Day 8 - Sunday

The next part of our tour takes us east towards the Pyrenees to the Hostal Lola, Isaba potentially via one of Henry Catchpoles favourite driving roads. [285 km, 4 hours]

#### Day 9 - Monday

Explore the sights, waterfalls and walks in the region.

#### Day 10 - Tuesday

Drive to the Vielha region with its 2000m high peaks.

The Pyrenees are a breathtaking mountain range whose jagged spine runs along the border that separates France and Spain.


