CONCOURS RULES & REGULATIONS

HANBURY MANOR

SATURDAY 19 OCTOBER 2019

REGULATIONS AND CONDITIONS ON THE DAY AND NUMBER OF ENTRIES MAY FORCE CHANGES TO THESE RULES AND REGULATIONS. SUCH CHANGES WILL BE AT THE DISCRETION OF THE CONCOURS COORDINATOR. ANY QUERIES RELATING TO THESE REGULATIONS SHOULD BE ADDRESSED TO THE CONCOURS COMMITTEE.

1. CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE

The pinnacle of Concours classes, entries are by selection only, being judged as a single class. Owners are to offer their cars for consideration. Previous class winners from Pride of Ownership will be considered.

2. PRIDE OF OWNERSHIP CLASSES

These classes of Concours are to encourage "Pride of Ownership" by way of a display and competition. Concours preparation will endorse the best maintenance and aesthetics of Porsche cars and cars will be judged as presented.

3. ELIGIBILITY

- 3.1 All competitors must be paid up members of PCGB. Entries must be made on the official entry form and submitted by the closing date on the entry form. Entries received after this closing date will be at the discretion of the Concours Committee.
- 3.2 Each accepted entry must be registered at the signing-on desk by 10 am on Saturday 19th October 2019.
- 3.3 Entry tickets to the event will need to be purchased.
- 3.4 Entries will be restricted to Porsche manufactured vehicles only.
- 3.5 Each competitor will receive all necessary display and judging information prior to the event.
- 3.6 Each vehicle must have current MOT where appropriate and be in road worthy condition. A safety inspection will not be part of the judging process, but visible safety hazards noted by the judges will be penalised.
- 3.7 The overall champion from the previous year's Porsche Club National Concours will not be eligible to enter

4. SCORING: GENERAL

The judges will be briefed to focus on cleanliness, quality of presentation and overall condition of the vehicle: cleanliness referring to all scoring areas of the vehicle having received attention, presentation referring to the level of precise detailing in all scoring areas, overall condition referring to the appearance and condition of all scoring areas.

5. SCORING: SPECIFICS

- 5.1 Vehicles will be judged as an assembled unit. Parts such as wheels, bumpers, tops, etc, must be attached to

The car in the specified position and manner. Hoods/soft tops/targa roof panels must be raised or in place as the case may be.

5.2 Each vehicle will be marked out of the possible total points as indicated on the judges marking sheet, according to the following categories – Exterior/Interior/Luggage bay/Engine bay*. Multiple judges will be used to provide a balanced view.

5.3 In each class there will be 20 additional Discretionary points available, to be added by the judges in their appreciation of each car.

5.4 In the event of a points tie at the completion of judging, the winner will be at the discretion of the Concours Committee.

Attention is drawn that each competitor should display on their vehicle a Porsche Club GB badge Club GB badge on the front windscreen. Failure to display one of these badges as indicated will result in 5 points being deducted from the overall final score.

6. JUDGING

6.1 On arrival, you will be shown to your parking place. You should then sign on without delay when you will be advised of your judging time. Vehicles will be judged either in their parking space or under cover depending on weather conditions.

6.2 Judging will commence at 10.30am, please ensure you are with your vehicle 5 minutes prior the judging time indicated on your score sheet and that you must remain with your vehicle throughout the judging process.

6.3 Once judging commences on your vehicle no further work can be performed on your vehicle.

6.4 The judging team will comprise individuals selected for their broad knowledge of the Porsche marque who also have specialised knowledge to decide on certain points (particularly originality).

6.5 There will be one team of judges to ensure consistency of judging. Please do not attempt to discuss any matter with the judges whilst they are judging vehicles unless the judge asks a specific question. The judges will spend the same amount of time on each car. The timekeeper will control this.

6.6 Competitors should affix their competition hanger to the rearview mirror of their car and are asked to display their competition number clearly to help the judges locate it.

6.7 Judging is a difficult job. Please do not talk to or distract the judges during their task.

7 AWARDS

There will be permanent trophies for the winners to keep for each of the classes.

8 RESULTS

Results will be available on the day of the Concours. The Judges decision is final. Individual score sheets will be forwarded to each competitor after the event. Results will be published in Porsche Post.

9 HEALTH AND SAFETY

Competitors are reminded that they should take precautions to ensure the Health and Safety of themselves and others, for example: during vehicle preparation providing a board that is adequate to carry the weight of the vehicle and large enough to accommodate the size of the jack to enable the jack and/or axle stands to have a firm base when used on soft, rough or uneven ground. Additional support of vehicles when raised on jacks, i.e. axle stands, should be used. Competitors should ensure that harmful substances are properly contained and wear any necessary PPE when handling

these substances. The Concours area is a strictly non smoking area due to the fact that competitors may be using substances that contain flammable materials. Trip hazards should be avoided. The Concours area must be kept clear during preparation time with the exception of the Concours Coordinator, the competitors, the Concours judges and other appointed officials such as time keepers and marshals in order to avoid a member of the public being hurt. For their own safety whilst a car is jacked up and/or on axle stands, any person or persons accompanying Concours competitors (i.e. wives, children or friends) should cease assisting with the car preparation and leave the Concours area.

As part of the judging process competitors cars may be driven on and off a judging platform/ramp. This operation for Health and Safety reasons will only be undertaken by a Specified Driver appointed by the Concours Coordinator. The Specified Driver will be fully insured in the event of accidental damage occurring whilst in their control up to a limit of £150,000. Any competitor with an agreed value greater than this amount must specify their agreed insured value on the official entry form.

Any queries or matters arising regarding Health and Safety should be directed to the Concours Coordinator who will refer these to the Operations Director who will be on hand if needed.
